Tournament Positives:

- We won 4 of our 6 games played to finish 3rd out of 10 teams.
- In these games won we scored 56 goals to 25 against.
- In these games we employed a strong defensive press and counterattack strategy to good effect.
- When we managed to get an accurate pass into the CF position, we were dangerous scoring goals and gaining exclusion.
- We scored 12/19 man-ups (63% success)
- All our players gained contributory water time across the first 5 games.
- Our players showed great effort and determination in all games throughout the weekend

Areas to work on:

- Kick up high when trying to pass or protect the ball (boxer stance) under pressure to minimise possession loss or get a foul quickly.
- Avoid long cross pool passes over defenders as they can be easily intercepted.
- If the defender gets ball side when marking, move to clear the space early.
 Drive hard into any spaces vacated
- When defending a drive, avoid giving the opposition inside water, direct them away from your goal. If they do get inside water, pressurise with hands up to avoid conceding exclusion/penalty.
- Communicate more readily against driving attackers to call switches in marking.
- When swimming forward to the goal with the ball, pick up early to avoid GK steal.
 Go vertical and move forward/ to the side with brst kick to engage/move the GK
- When facing a drop/zone defence, move forward into shooting range if on the ball, or pass to the nearest team mate then drive diagonally to the other post to take the dropping defender away.
